INTERNATIONAL 420 CLASS ASIA-OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS 30 APRIL – 6 MAY 2024

Japan 420 Sailing Association in co-operation with the International 420 Class Association are pleased to invite 420 sailors to take part in the:

2024 420 Asia-Oceania Championship (for Men & Mixed crews) 2024 420 Women's Asia-Oceania Championship (for female crews)

and

2024 420 U17 Asia-Oceania Championship (for all U17 crews)

in Enoshima, Japan from 30 April – 6 May 2024

1. RULES

- 1.1 The Championship will be governed by the rules as defined in *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS). Other documents under RRS Definition Rule (g) include the 420 Class Event Measurement Regulations and Policies.
- 1.2 National Authority prescriptions will not apply.
- 1.3 No Class Rule variations will apply.
- 1.4 In all rules governing this championship:
- 1.4.1 [NP] denotes a rule that shall not be grounds for protests by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).





- 1.4.2 [SP] denotes a rule which a standard penalty may be applied by the Race Committee without a hearing, or a discretionary penalty applied by the International Jury with a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.
- 1.5 If boat is to produce a measurement certificate, she shall do so before 19:00 on 1 May 2024. This changes RR 78.2.
- 1.6 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2. [SP] [NP] ADVERTISING AND BOW NUMBERS

- 2.1 Boats may be required to display bow numbers and/or advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies.
- 2.2 From the second racing day, competitors ranking first, second and third in the series at the beginning of each day shall wear on top of their clothing yellow, blue and red bibs respectively, while racing that day. The bibs will be provided by the Organizing Authority.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to boats of the 420 Class and to competitors who comply with World Sailing Regulation 19 - Eligibility Code. On 1 March 2022, World Sailing published the following recommendations in reaction to the situation in Ukraine: https://www.sailing.org/2022/03/01/world-sailing-statement-6/. preserve the To help integrity and safety of the 2024 420 Asia-Oceania Championships, entries shall be open to competitors of all nationalities, but not to competitors holding only Russian or Belarusian nationality.
- 3.2 Participating crews in the championship shall be entered by their National 420 Class Association or by their National Authority where there is no National Association. Only crews representing nations in good standing with the International 420 Class Association may participate. Each crew member shall be member of a National 420 Class Association affiliated to the National Authority.
- 3.3 The number of entries are not limited. Only Men or Mixed teams are authorised to enter the Asia-Oceania Championship. Only women teams are authorised to enter the Women's Asia-Oceania Championship. For the U17 category each crew member shall not have attained his or her 17th birthday on or before 31/12/2024 (born in 2008 or later). For the U15 sub-category each crew member shall not have attained his or her 15th birthday on or before 31/12/2024 (born in 2010 or later).
- 3.4 All entries shall be made online at the Event Website:

- 3.5 Competitors under 18 years of age shall present a signed and completed parent or guardian consent and declaration form during the on-site registration.
- 3.6 All Coaches with support boats must register by completing the registration form available online on the website related to the event by 28 April 2024

4. FEES

- 4.1 The entry fee is JPY 60,000 per boat. The entry fee is reduced to JPY 50,000 per boat for boats that have completed online entry and paid their entry fee on or before 1st April 2024.
- 4.2 Entry fees shall be paid in JPY to the Japan 420 Sailing Association's bank Account:

- 4.3 ALL BANK TRANSFERS SHOULD BE CLEARLY ANNOTATED WITH THE NAME OF <u>THE COUNTRY, THE EVENT AND THE SAIL NUMBERS AND/OR NAMES OF THE</u> <u>COMPETITORS.</u> Please advise when bank transfer has been made by email to: yachties@extra.ocn.ne.jp
- 4.4 Entry fees to be paid by Support Teams (coaches, team leaders and representatives from participating nations) are JPY 12,000 per person and **shall be paid directly to the** Organizing Authority at registration.
- 4.5 These entry fees include all collective services provided by the Organizing Authority, such as social events, boat park facilities, toilets and showers.

5. CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

- 5.1 Men/Mixed, Women and U17 fleets shall race separately. The OA reserves the right to combine fleets if entry numbers are lower than
- 5.2 Each event will be raced as a single series event consisting of 10 races.

6. SCHEDULE

6.1 Schedule of races:

6.2 No warning signal will be given after 16:00 on the last racing day.

6.3 No more than three races shall be sailed each day.

7. [SP] [NP] MEASUREMENT

- 7.1 A Technical Committee shall be appointed in accordance with RRS 92.
- 7.2 All boats shall be inspected before racing on the days specified in this Notice of Race. A boat will be eligible to compete and complete event registration after Equipment Inspection has been completed.
- 7.3 Each boat shall produce a valid Measurement certificate, accompanied by the hull measurement form (IMF), both of which must be presented during the pre-race inspection. Only original or certified true copies of these documents shall be accepted. Event charter





boats are excluded from this obligation, but they must be accompanied by original or certified true copies of their measurement form.

- 7.4 Sails shall be certified and marked by an official measurer before being presented for inspection. No sail shall be accepted for inspection if it is not certified according to the class rules, and no member of the equipment inspection team shall certify sails on the spot.
- 7.5 In accordance with RRS 78, competitors are responsible for maintaining their boat in accordance with the Class Rules (for the purpose of RRS 78, competitors are considered to be the owners). Random equipment checks may be made at any time during the Championships.
- 7.6 The Event Measurement Regulations and Policies will be published on the Championship website before the start of the event and posted on the official notice board the day before the first day for event measurement.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available during registration at the Race Office and at the Championship website. Other documents governing the event will be published with the Sailing Instructions.

10. THE COURSES

The courses will be Trapezoid.

11. PENALTY SYSTEM & INTERNATIONAL JURY

- 11.1 RRS Appendix P, Special Procedures for RRS 42, will apply.
- 11.2. RRS P2.3 will not apply and RRS P2.2 is changed so that it will apply to any penalty after the first one.
- 11.3 An International Jury shall be appointed in accordance with RRS 91(b).
- 11.4 Decisions of the International Jury shall be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

12. SCORING

- 12.1 RRS Appendix A will apply.
- 12.2 There will be 10 races in the single series.
- 12.5 The championships will be valid if at least 6 races are completed.
- 12.5 Discards
 - When fewer than 3 races have been completed, a boat's series score is the total of her racescores.





 When 3 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score is the total of her racescores excluding her worst score.

13. [SP] [NP] SUPPORT TEAMS

- 13.1 All Support Team members shall be registered (see 3.6) with the Organizing Authority and will be required to comply with local legislation and event Support Team Regulations. The Organizing Authority may refuse registrations and accept later registrations at their sole discretion.
- 13.2 Registered Support Team members shall only use boats chartered from the Organizing Authority. They shall fly a flag with their three-letter national code (see RRS G1.1) clearly displayed, or shall carry a sticker of their three-letter national code on each side of the boat or engine. The minimum height for the letters shall be 200 mm. The flag or stickers will not be provided by the Organizing Authority.
- 13.3 Registered Support Team boats shall act as assistance / rescue boats in case of need and shall comply with any instructions given by the Race Committee or the Organizing Authority.

14. [SP] [NP] BERTHING

When berthed, boats shall be kept in their assigned place at the boat park.

15. PRIZES AND TITLES

15.1 The first Men/Mixed crew of the final official ranking lists of the Championship and the first crew of Women's Championship will be declared respectively:

"International 420 Class Asia-OceaniaChampion"

"International 420 Class Women's Asia-OceaniaChampion"

15.2 The first Men/Mixed crew and the first women's U17 crew of the final official ranking lists of the U17 Championship will be declared respectively:

"International 420 Class U17 Asia-Oceania Champion"

"International 420 Class U17 Women's Asia-OceaniaChampion"

- 15.3 Medals will be awarded to the first, second and third place crews of the Championships as above by the International 420 Class Association.
- 15.4 The first ten teams in the ranking list of each fleet shall be given a trophy by the Organizing Authority.
- 15.5 The medals and prizes are given to both crew members.

16. RISK STATEMENT

- 16.1 Competitors and support team members participate in the Championship entirely at their own risk and they are reminded of the provisions of RRS 3, Decision to Race. Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
- 16.1.1 They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- 16.1.2 They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;





- 16.1.3 They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- 16.1.4 By participating in any race, they are satisfied that their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- 16.1.5 The provision of a race management team, safety boats, judges and other officials and volunteers by the organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- 16.1.6 The provision of safety boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- 16.1.7 They will familiarize themselves with any venue/event specific risks, adhere to rules and information produced for the venue/event and they will attend any venue/event safety briefings.

17. [SP] [NP] MEDIA RIGHTS, CAMERAS AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

- 17.1 By participating in the Championship, competitors automatically grant to the International 420 Class Association and to the Organizing Authority and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.
- 17.2 Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment or positioning equipment as specified by the organizing authority and in accordance with Class Rule C.5.1 (a) (2).

18. INSURANCE

18.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of EUR 1,000,000 per event or equivalent. The Organizing Authority is not responsible for verifying the status or validity of such certificates.
